EVENT OVERVIEW

The Pāpāmoa Junior Surf Carnival has a **teams** focus for all age groups. The carnival is for under 8 – under 14 age groups.

Entry Cost: \$15 per competitor

High Visibility Vests: High vis vests are compulsory for all water event competitors, including all warm-up and warm-down sessions

Racing Uniform: Club caps are compulsory

200m Safety Badge: All junior members who wish to use foam or fibreglass paddleboards and/or swim beyond waist depth, must hold their 200m safety badge. This is a mandatory safety requirement which demonstrates that junior members are confident in the ocean and capable of returning to shore if they are separated from their equipment. The badge must be displayed on each individual competitor's beanie or togs.

MISSING PERSONS AT SEA PROTOCOL

Any lifeguards/parents who are competent swimmers please bring fins, goggles, wetsuit jacket or wetsuit so they can assist if there is a missing person at sea. Please ensure all team managers, coaches and parents are familiar with the missing persons at sea system.

CLUB REQUIREMENTS TO PROVIDE OFFICIALS/HELPERS

All clubs must provide at least one official with good knowledge of the events to assist our officials based on the ratio of one official per 10 athletes. Clubs with under 10 participants are not required to provide assistance unless they have capacity to do so. Unfortunately, teams/athletes are not permitted to participate unless they have the required parental/adult support ratios. Additional parent helper and/or qualified lifeguard for water safety assistance may be required to run this carnival effectively.

AGE GROUPS BY ARENA

1. U8 & U9
U10
2. U11 & U12
3. U13 & U14

Please note that age groups are dependent upon the number of entries and surf/weather conditions. Age group is determined by the competitor's age as at 30th September 2023. For example, if you are 11 on the 30th September 2023, you will race in the U12 age group.

TEAM MAKE UPS U8, U9 and U10

Entry System: Is via the Teams Declaration Form (TDF) needs to be fully completed and emailed to info@papamoalifeguards.co.nz prior to **5pm Friday 10th January 2024** – TDF attached to this event information circular.

- **200m Badge:** All U10s team members need to have their 200m badge to participate in water events of the knee board and the Swim legs.
- **Teams Categories:** Age groups are as per SLSNZ regulations, Participants can only race for one team for the day. The following team categories will be available to enter in:
- **Boys Team (U8/U9/U10)** – Must be all boys within the age group team can register between 4-6 participants and sub one in or out as required in each of relay events.
- **Girls Team (U8/U9/U10)** – Must be all girls within the age group team can register between 4-6 participants and sub one in or out as required in each of relay events.
- **Mixed Team (U8/U9/U10)** - Minimum of 2 x boys or 2 x girls in each age group team can register between 4 and 6 participants and sub one in or out as required in each of relay events.

Arenas and Events

- Each age group will rotate through an arena with the U10s starting in Water Arena 2, U9s in Water Arena 1 and U8s in Beach Arena
- Each arena will have 75mins max to complete Boys Teams Races, Girls Teams Races and Mixed Teams Races.
- **Beach Arena (Order U8, U9, U10)**
 - 1. Beach Flags Teams (4 Person)
 - 2. Beach Relay (4 Person)
- **Water Arena 1 (Order U9, U10, U8)**
 - 1. Tube Wade/Swim Relay (3 Person)
 - 2. Run Wade/Swim/Wade Relay (3 Person)
- **Water Arena 2 (Order U10, U8, U9)**
 - 1. Boogie Board/Board Relay (3 person)
 - 2. Cameron Relay (4 person)

Points Score

- In each relay event points will be awarded to each age group and team category, first place will be awarded the maximum points which will equal the number of teams entered, counting down to last place getting 1 point.

- Points will be accumulated across all relay races, a DNF or disqualification will result in zero points been awarded.
- At the Event Prizegiving places will be awarded and recognised from 1st to last place on the day across each age group and team category. Every team will be presented with a prize to recognise their participation so we need all to attend prize giving. Top three teams will receive place getter medals.
- Prize Giving will be 30mins after the end of all 3 rotations.

 - Run Swim Run team of 4 (2 swim, 2 RWR)
 - Grand Cameron team of 4 (1 x knee board paddler, 1 x RWR, 1 x swimmer, 1 x sprinter)

Each club can enter multiple teams made up of either girls, boys or mixed in each age group. Please note that for the flags, tube and board rescue events, these can ONLY be either boys or girls teams. Participants can only compete once in each race they can not be in multiple teams per event. Entry sheets attached with Coaches declaration for 200m safety badge.

EVENTS

The events listed are dependent upon the number of entries and surf/weather conditions. The rules for each of these events can be found in the Surf Sports Competition Manual.

Flag Teams

Essentially flags but with a surf teams style points system. Teams of four will work together to finish with the most accumulative points. Points will be award to every individual participant as they are eliminated. Team totals will be added up at the end. Before the event starts, every participant will be randomly spread out over the Snake. A round of flag teams will consist of a full rotation of the head of the Snake. A new "round" will begin every time, the head of the Snake enters /re-enters the arena regardless of if the tail of the previous round has run. Points With every "round" a participant survives, the points they are awarded upon

elimination increases by 1. For example, in a snake of 10 teams of 4 (40 people), everyone eliminated before the head of the Snake re-enters the arena will receive 1 point. In the following round, everyone eliminated will receive 2 and so on. Two participants will be eliminated every round until there are less than 9 participants. After this point, the order will be randomized every round, and only 1 participant will be eliminated each round.

PRESENTATIONS U11-14

Medals will be given for first, second and third place in each event age group category and will be presented at the conclusion of each arena racing at the base of the club house under the shade sails. All athletes are required at prizegiving as everyone will receive a prize, and lots of spot prizes also.
